SELECTIVE SERVICE INFORMATION SHEET

447-SEL(IS)
(Rev. 11/18)

By South Carolina (Section 56-1-125) and Federal law, effective June 28, 2004 if you are a male United States citizen or immigrant who is less than twenty-six years, the South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles (SCDMV) must send your Name, Address, Date of Birth, Sex, Social Security Number, and Date of Application to the U.S. Selective Service under certain conditions when you apply to DMV for any type of beginner's permit, driver's license, or identification card.

Males under the age of eighteen:

Individuals who are 13 - 17 years of age must have an individual listed in SC Code of Law Section 56-1-100(A)(1-7) sign the supplemental application Form 447-SEL indicating they have been informed that when the individual reaches the age of 18, the department will forward their information to the United States Selective Service UNLESS he physically surrenders ALL beginner's permit, driver's license, and identification cards issued by the SCDMV prior to his 18th birthday.

Males eighteen to twenty-five years old:

By submitting the application (Form 447-SEL) you are giving your consent to have your information sent to the US Selective Service by the SCDMV. If you fail to give your consent, your application for beginner's permit, driver's license, or identification card application must be denied by law. If you are 18 when you apply for a beginner's permit, driver's license or identification card, or once you turn 18, DMV will send your information to Selective Service. Selective Service will then send you a Selective Service Registration Card, if you have not already received one. If you do not receive a card, please contact Selective Services directly. Frequently Asked Questions

Can I renew my credential or obtain a duplicate and give my consent online?

Yes, if you are a US citizen and are at least 18 years old. Minors younger than 18 cannot obtain a renewal or duplicate online, UNLESS an individual listed in SC Code of Law Section 56-1-100(A)(1-7) has previously signed the notification form. Visit our website at www.scdmvonline.com

Can I renew my credential or obtain a duplicate through the mail?

Yes, provided that you are a US citizen. If you are over 18, submitting the Form DL-63 renewal by mail application represents your consent to be registered. If you are under 18, you and any individual listed in SC Code of Law Section 56-1-10(A)(1-7) must also complete the Form 447-SEL Selective Service Supplement, which can be obtained in any DMV office, or downloaded from our website www.scdmvonline.com

What if I do not consent to being registered with Selective Service?

If you are 18 - 26 years old, DMV is not permitted to issue you a beginner's permit, driver's license or identification card under SC law. If you are 13-17 years old, you may be issued a beginner's permit, driver's license or identification card; however, you will need to physically surrender to SCDMV any beginner's permit, driver's license or identification card in your possession BEFORE YOUR 18TH BIRTHDAY, or your information will be sent to Selective Service when you turn 18.

I do not believe I am required to register with Selective Service. Does this policy still apply to me?

DMV will send the information for all male customers who are 18 - 25 years old to Selective Service. Selective Service will determine whether you need to register. Please direct all inquiries regarding Selective Service requirements to the Selective Service, www.sss.gov/who.htm

I've already registered with Selective Service. Does this policy still apply to me?

DMV is required to send the information to Selective Service as a condition for your obtaining a beginner's permit, driver's license, or identification card, even if you've registered with Selective Service on your own. If Selective Service already has your information, they will not register you again. DMV will keep track of the individuals whose information was sent to Selective Service, and will not send the information more than once.
